Learning Objectives

1. Participants will gain an understanding of the phenomena of traumatic experience and the poor developmental outcomes for children when their trauma goes unrecognized and unaddressed.
2. Participants will have an understanding of the Child Development-Community Policing Program, a collaborative approach to early identification and response to traumatized children and families. They will also learn about the Child and Family Traumatic Stress Intervention, an early-stage, brief, evidence-based model for decreasing post-traumatic symptoms and longer term post-traumatic disorders.
3. Participants will better appreciate the challenges that can interfere with the recognition and response to childhood trauma by mental health professionals, social service providers, policy makers and the broader public.
